3:30 pm Rally ends.

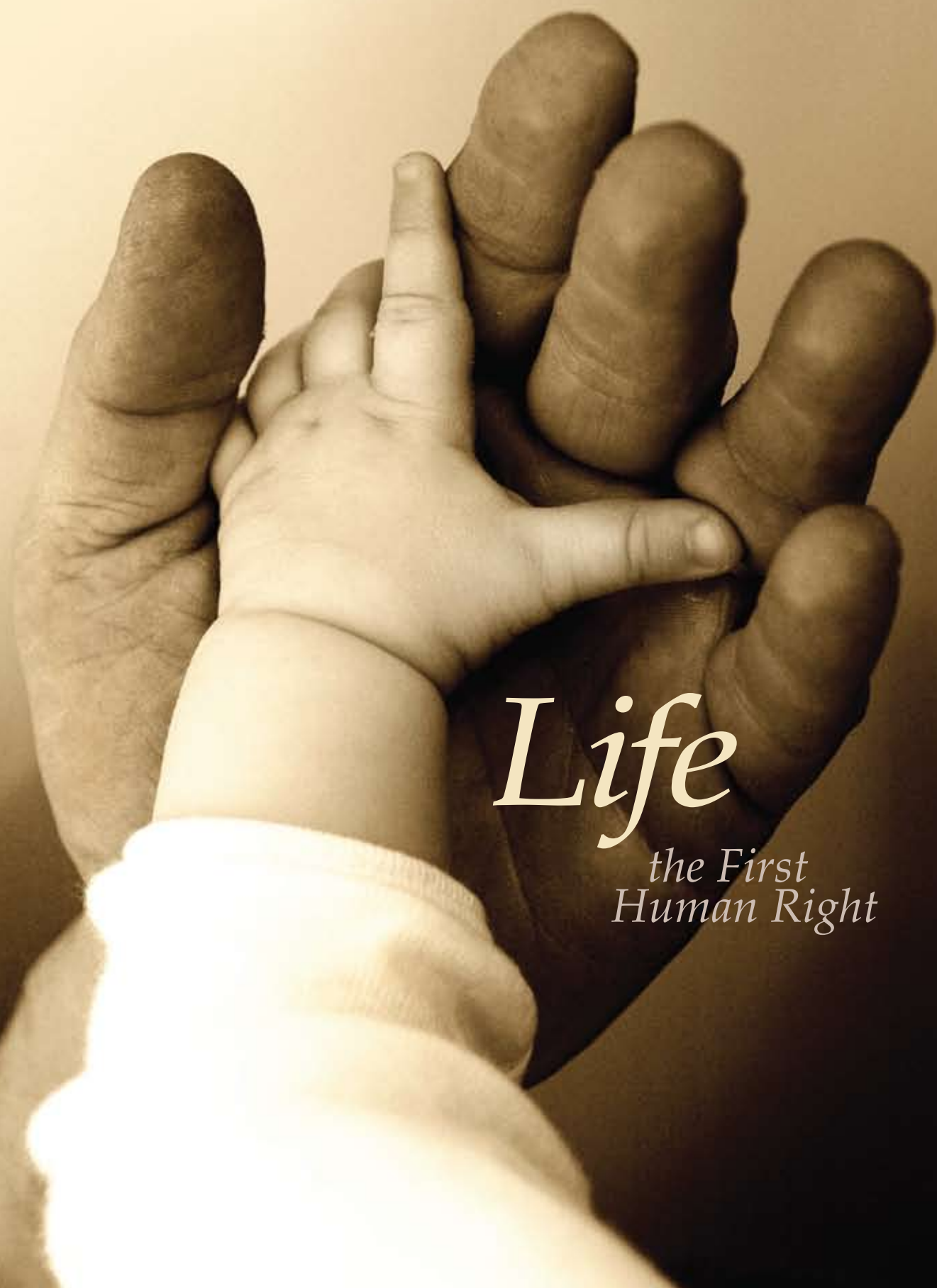
